

Packing List

Please label as much as you can. Kids tend to leave their things all over. It also helps us to return items at the end of the session if it is labeled.

<u>All medicine</u> must be checked in upon arrival to the camp medical team. <u>This includes all over-the-counter medication as well.</u> All medicine must be labeled clearly with the camper's name and proper instructions.

- Modest Camp play clothing
- Closed toe Shoes (must be always worn)
- Sandals for shower
- o Pajamas
- o Toiletries (soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, brushes, etc)
- Laundry bag or plastic bag for wet & dirty clothes
- o Bible & Pencil (We have free ones if your camper does not have one)
- Daypack or backpack (to carry around a water bottle, Bible, and other stuff)
- Water bottle (refillable)
- Money for snack shack and country store (you can preload cash online if you don't want your camper to carry it around and possibly lose it)
- SunscreenFlashlight
- Bug sprayLip balm

Raincoat or poncho

Bath towel

Pillow

Light coat or sweatshirt

Warm clothes (it can still get cold)

Sleeping bag or twin sheet set & blanket

- o Camera (optional)
- Hat and/or sunglasses

DO NOT BRING

- Electronics INCLUDING CELL PHONES, music players, computers & videogames. Cell phones are a distraction, and campers who bring them spend less time making new friends and experiencing new adventures.
- Fireworks
- Water guns
- Expensive clothing or shoes
- Weapons (including pocket knives)
- Skateboards/skates
- No Tobacco, marijuana, alcohol, or illegal drugs
